ORDINANCE NO. 2022-01

AN ORDINANCE CANCELLING THE MAY 07, 2022 REGULAR ELECTION AND DECLARING EACH UNOPPOSED CANDIDATE ELECTED TO OFFICE; PROVIDING THATA THIS ORDINANCESHALL BE CUMULATIVE OF ALL ORDINANACES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Beasley is a genera law municipality located in Fort Bend County, created in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.053 of local Government Code and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the law a general election has been ordered for May 01, 2021 for the purpose of electing three (3) Council Members to serve on the City Council in the City of Beasley; and

WHEREAS, no proposition is to appear on the ballot in that election; and

WHEREAS, the City Secretary has certified in writing that each candidate on the ballot is unopposed for election to office; and

WHEREAS, the filling deadlines for placement on the ballot and declaration of write-in candidacy has passed;

WHEREAS, in these circumstances Sub-chapter C of Chapter 2 of the Texas Election Code §67.006 authorizes a governing body to declare each unopposed candidate elected to office and cancel the election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEASLEY THAT:

SECTION 1

The following candidates, who is unopposed in the May 07, 2022 general election, are hereby declared elected to office, and shall be issued a certificate of election:

Yvonne Meyer – Council Member

Deleon, Ernest – Council Member Lamensky, Cary – Council Member

SECTION 2

The City Secretary is directed to post a copy of this ordinance at each designated polling place on May 07, 2021.

SECTION 3

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of Ordinances of the City of Beasley, Texas, except where the provisions of this Ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such Ordinances, in which event the conflicting provisions of such Ordinances are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the phrases, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of the Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgement or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without incorporation in this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

SECTION 5

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, and it is so ordained.
